


FIG. 8.—STATUETTE OF "VENUS GENETRIX" TYPE





- D' (JK) HEAD WIDTH











FIG. 16.—THE THREE STAGES OF TREATMENT OF THE EYE IN GREEK VASE-PAINTING.





FIG. 17.—TYPES OF EYES FROM EUPHRONIAN VASES.




Fig. 1: The nomarch Ukh-Hotep has been depicted on an original grid showing the subdivisions as five parts. In *CP75*, plate 6.3, all that is shown are the servants behind the throne with the drawing cut along line Z-Z. The entire drawing is about three times longer than here

shown, and in front of Ukh-Hotep are several standing and kneeling visitors, all of them drawn on a grid. As shown here, the scene are reproduced from Blackman, *Meir II*, pl. X. See also note 25 of this review article.




Fig. 2a shows Amenophis III with the original 1st-canon grid as published by R. Lepsius, *Denkmäler aus Aegypten und Aethiopen*, Band V, III, Bl. 70. Compare the corresponding lines on fig. 3.




Fig. 2b shows Amenophis with the same number of subdivisions as the enthroned Ukh-Hotep (fig. 1), but here with preferential lines as in the typical 2nd-canon grid. That is to say that, here, every fourth line is shown instead of every fifth (cf. the corresponding lines on fig. 4).






Fig. 4: Proceeding from figs. 2 and 3 showing each fourth Ukh-Hotep inch along the 2nd-canon grid in the same way as in the Amenophis drawing (fig. 2b). The length of the chordline at the top of the head corresponds to the
